Winter Pressures and Winter Vaccinations

During the meeting it was highlighted that the main focus of the Integrated Care Board is on winter planning, this included the delivery of winter vaccinations.

HNY HCP are looking to identify resource for the VCSE sector across Humber and North Yorkshire to support people to keep well during winter by promoting the importance of vaccinations.

Funding will be calculated for each place based on a national calculation focusing on health inequalities. VCSE Place Leads will work through the VCSE place-based assemblies to identify VCSE organisations that can deliver this work over the winter period through targeted work with the following audiences;

- Carers who are eligible for vaccination including people using personal assistants
- People who are housebound and find it difficult to access vaccination
- Health inclusion groups
- Areas of deprivation (which have a lower rate of uptake of vaccination)

Social Prescribing Conference and Networking Event

Head of VCSE, Gary Sainty, provided an overview of the Social Prescribing Conference which took place Thursday 5 October. The event brought social prescribers and link workers together from across Humber and North Yorkshire for the second Social Prescribing Conference this year.

The conference provided an excellent networking and learning opportunity for attendees by exploring the Social Prescribing Maturity Framework and sharing best practice from the different social prescribing models. Feedback and learning from the event will help to further develop social prescribing across Humber and North Yorkshire and identify the challenges faced.

Useful definitions:

Integrated Care Systems (ICSs) - are partnerships that bring together providers and commissioners of NHS services across a geographical area with local authorities and other local partners to collectively plan health and care services to meet the needs of their population.

Integrated Care Board (ICB) - an organisation with responsibility for NHS functions and budgets for the ICS.

Integrated Care Partnership (ICP) - a statutory committee of the ICB bringing together all system partners to produce a health and care strategy.

Place-based / At place - Refers to the geographical locations across Humber and North Yorkshire.
