NHS England refer to Allied Health Professions as Art Therapists, Dramatherapists, Music Therapists, Podiatrists, Dietitians, Occupational Therapists, Operating Department Practitioners, Orthoptists, Osteopaths, Paramedics, Physiotherapists, Prosthetists and Orthotist, Radiographers and Speech and Language Therapists.

# Humber and North Yorkshire Health and Care Partnership

The Humber and North Yorkshire Health and Care Partnership have developed a <u>careers hub</u>. Those looking for a career in Health and Social Care can explore different careers and profession through the 'explore careers' tab. From here they can complete a quiz to find their

career along with comparing average wages, working hours and predicted trends.

Within the Allied Health Professions tab, they can explore careers from support worker roles to registered healthcare professional. Information provided includes qualifications, experience, pathway, location, and case studies.

There is also a tab for 'education and training' to explore routes into a Health and Social care career including further education, apprenticeships, adult learning, T-levels and university.

Those looking for a career can explore career opportunities available currently along with exploring organisations within Humber and North Yorkshire.

# NHS Learning Support Fund (LSF)

Those applying to university for either a pre-registration undergraduate or postgraduate course may be eligible for the <u>NHS learning support</u> <u>fund</u>. Allied Health Professions included are: Dietetics, Occupational Therapy, Operating Department Practitioner (ODP), Orthoptics, Orthotics

and Prosthetics, Paramedics (some courses excluded), Physiotherapy, Podiatry, Diagnostic Radiographer, Therapeutic Radiographer and Speech and Language Therapy. Please visit the website linked above for further information of what funding those applying may be eligible for.

# **Applying for University Courses**

To apply for a University course you will need to register with the <u>UCAS</u> <u>hub</u>. You can start your application from here. You can find more

# Apprenticeships

Apprenticeships are offered in a variety of subjects across Humber and North Yorkshire. At the end of this guide, there is a list of websites to search vacancies including apprenticeships. However, many apprenticeships are offered in house meaning you may need to already be employed within the organisation to access these apprenticeships.

There are different levels of apprenticeships available ranging from level 2-7. Each level is equivalent to a qualification level, examples below:

- Level 2: GCSE
- Level 3: A Level
- Level 4 and 5: Higher level apprenticeship
- Level 6: Degree level qualification
- Level 7: Master's degree



Apprenticeships within Allied Health Professions (AHP) are increasing, with degree level apprenticeships becoming available for many AHP professions within our system. Level 3 and 5 profession specific apprenticeships will begin delivery Nationally from September 2023.

### **Work Experience**

Often when applying for jobs or University courses, you may be asked for experience. This may be from a previous job role or work experience. The Humber and North Yorkshire are in the process of producing a virtual work experience offer for the system. <u>Yorkshire Health and Care Partnership</u> for an update on this. In the meantime, applicants can contact their local organisation for work experience or volunteering opportunities. There are many aspects of health and care that are applicable to a career as an Allied Health Professional or Support Worker. Skills such as patient care, communication and team work are integral to this role.
